I want to check-in with you as we look back at the last quarter because well-being is at the core of dignity work. As a donor to our Seeking Shelter fund in San Francisco, thank you for recognizing the inherent dignity of all people.

Dignity can be shown in ways big and small. This month, our ALMA team spent a couple of hours preparing and plating meals with Miriam's Kitchen here in DC, and the staff emphasized the importance of serving high-quality, healthy food and being sure to smile and greet the guests. Lava Mae, a mobile shower nonprofit in the Seeking Shelter fund, offers guests two things that are in short supply when you're unhoused: privacy and a hot shower.

Maybe the key is being intentional in how we support people experiencing homelessness, and not just that we do. What do you think?
